N2	<ul> <li>The ability to understand Japanese used in everyday situations, and in a variety of circumstances to a certain degree.</li> <li>[Reading]</li> <li>One is able to read materials written clearly on a variety of topics, such as articles and commentaries in newspapers and magazines as well as simple critiques, and comprehend their contents.</li> <li>One is also able to read written materials on general topics and follow their narratives as well as understand the intent of the writers.</li> <li>[Listening]</li> <li>One is able to comprehend orally presented materials such as coherent conversations and news reports, spoken at nearly natural speed in everyday situations as well as in a variety of settings, and is able to follow their ideas and comprehend their contents. One is also able to understand the relationships among the people involved and the essential points of the presented materials.</li> </ul>

## I. The Japanese-Language Proficiency Test

## 1. Objectives and Administration of the Test

#### (1) Objectives

The Japanese-Language Proficiency Test is held in Japan and abroad to evaluate and certify Japanese-language proficiency of non-native speakers.

#### (2) Administrative Organizations

The Japan Foundation works with local host institutions to administer the test outside Japan. (In Taiwan, the Japan Foundation and the Japan-Taiwan Exchange Association jointly administer the test.) It is administered by Japan Educational Exchanges and Services in Japan.

#### (3) Eligibility

Applicants should be, in principle, non-native speakers of Japanese.

#### 2. Contents of the Test

#### (1) Test Sections and Test Times

The table below shows the sections of the test and the times allotted for each section.

Levels **N1** and **N2** have TWO test sections each: (1) Language Knowledge (Vocabulary/ Grammar) & Reading; and (2) Listening. Levels **N3**, **N4**, and **N5** have THREE test sections each: (1)Language Knowledge (Vocabulary); (2)Language Knowledge (Grammar) & Reading; and (3) Listening.

The new test times of "Language Knowledge (Vocabulary)" and "Language Knowledge (Grammar) & Reading" in levels N4 and N5 were applied from the test in December 2020.

Starting from the December 2022 exam, the test time for the N1 "Listening" has been changed. Sample questions of the test are available on the JLPT website at https://www.jlpt.jp/e/.

Levels N1, N2, and N3 have THREE scoring sections each: ① Language Knowledge (Vocabulary/Grammar), ②Reading and ③Listening. Levels N4 and N5 have TWO scoring sections each: ①Language Knowledge (Vocabulary/Grammar) & Reading and ②Listening.

\*Scaled score introduced with the current JLPT is based on a common score scale and show a more equitable correspondence between the examinee's Japanese language ability and his or her score.

(4) Pass or Fail

To pass, (1) the total score must be at or above the passing score (overall pass mark) and (2) the score for each section must be at or above the passing score for that section (sectional pass mark). If the score for one scoring section is below the sectional pass mark, the examinee fails, no matter how high the total score might be. Furthermore, if there are sections which an examinee does not sit for, no points will be given for the entire test, including any sections which the examinee completes. A failing mark will be given to the examinee.

#### (5) Understanding JLPT Certificates

Examinees will receive a "Certificate of Result and Scores." As in the sample below, the Certificate of Result and Scores will show ①scores for each section, ②the total score and ③reference information. The reference information is provided as a guide for the examinees' future Japanese study, and is NOT intended to determine pass or fail.

Also, ④a percentile rank is indicated on the Certificate of Result and Scores of examinees who passed the test overseas (excluding those who were exempt from the Listening section), showing the percentage of examinees with a score lower than yours in the six latest tests, including the one you took. \*Your reference information is located on the back of the Certificate of Result and Scores.

\*The reference information for the Language Knowledge (Vocabulary/Grammar) section shows that the Vocabulary category has been rated A, which means that 67% or more of the responses were correct.
